


ORDINANCE NO. 20-10-21-1

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE EMERALD BAY SERVICE DISTRICT
ADOPTING BY REFERENCE ORDINANCE NO. 2020-1 OF THE
SOUTH ORANGE COUNTY WASTEWATER AUTHORITY
REGULATING DISCHARGE TO SEWERAGE FACILITIES**

Ordinance No. 20-10-21-1 (the "Ordinance") repeals and replaces Exhibit A to Ordinance No. 15-04-15-1 [Adopted in April 2015 with same name as this ordinance], which was adopted by the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the Emerald Bay Service District (the "District") on April 8, 2015, by, among other things: (1) Adding terms regarding "Indirect Discharge;" (2) Amending terms regarding "National Pretreatment Standards," "Slug Discharge," "Non-Stormwater Discharge," and "Stormwater;" (3) Referencing the Enforcement Response Plan; and (4) Modifying language regarding Self-Monitoring and Reporting to be more consistent with Federal Regulations.

The Ordinance will be presented for introduction at the October 21, 2020 Board meeting. ORDINANCE NO. 20-10-21-1

AN ORDINANCE OF THE EMERALD BAY SERVICE DISTRICT ADOPTING BY REFERENCE ORDINANCE NO. 2020-1 OF THE SOUTH ORANGE COUNTY WASTEWATER AUTHORITY REGULATING DISCHARGE TO SEWERAGE FACILITIES

WHEREAS, the South Orange County Wastewater Authority ("SOCWA") is a joint powers authority that collects, treats and disposes of wastewater from the service areas of member agencies located in southern Orange County, California. SOCWA's member agencies include the City of Laguna Beach, City of San Clemente, City of San Juan Capistrano, El Toro Water District, Emerald Bay Service District, Irvine Ranch Water District, Moulton Niguel Water District, Santa Margarita Water District, South Coast Water District and the Trabuco Canyon Water District (each a "Member Agency"); and

WHEREAS, on April 2, 2015, SOCWA adopted an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance of Regulations for the Discharge of Wastewater to Sewerage Facilities of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority Service Area" ("Ordinance No. 2015-1"); and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2020 SOCWA adopted Ordinance No. 2020-1 entitled "An Ordinance of Regulations for the Discharge of Wastewater to Sewerage Facilities of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority Service Area" ("Ordinance No. 2020-1"), which Ordinance No. 2020-1 repealed and replaced Ordinance No. 2015-1; and

WHEREAS, among other things, Ordinance No. 2020-1 amended and changed Ordinance No. 2015-1 by:

- Adding terms regarding "Indirect Discharge;"
- Amending terms regarding "National Pretreatment Standards, " Slug Discharge," "Non-Stormwater Discharge," and "Stormwater;"
- Referencing the Enforcement Response Plan; and
- Modifying language regarding Self-Monitoring and Reporting to be more consistent with Federal Regulations.

WHEREAS, the objectives of Ordinance No. 2020-1 are to:

- Enable compliance with various regulatory agencies and the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) requirements;
- Prevent the introduction of pollutants that may cause interference of sewerage facility operations;

- Identify the goals, objectives and procedures for complying with federal pretreatment standards;
- Prevent biosolids contamination;
- Promote the opportunity to recycle or reclaim wastewaters, or biosolids from sewerage facilities;
- Encourage waste minimization and material substitution by users;
- Protect sewerage facility employees and the general public who may be affected by wastewater, biosolids or chemical hazards;
- Encourage the reuse, recycling or reduction of water, wastewater or solids that are discharged to sewerage facilities;
- Minimize the discharge of volatile organic compounds that could individually or collectively contribute to a decrease in the quality of air emissions from sewerage facilities;
- Establish an effective monitoring program for the control of user discharges to sewerage facilities;
- Establish an enforcement response plan;
- Equitably distribute costs;
- Prevent the introduction of pollutants into sewerage facilities that may pass through a sewerage facility inadequately treated, into receiving waters, or otherwise be incompatible with sewerage facilities;
- Incorporate the necessary laws and regulations in order to implement and enforce federal, State of California, SOCWA and Member Agency standards; and
- Seek to identify users that discharge or have the potential to discharge toxic pollutants, non-compatible or excessive amounts of compatible wastes to sewerage facilities.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Emerald Bay Service District ("District") has determined that it is in the District's best interest to adopt SOCWA's Ordinance No. 2020-1 as its own.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors of the Emerald Bay Service District does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 2020-1, entitled "An Ordinance of Regulations for the Discharge of Wastewater to Sewerage Facilities of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority Service Area" and adopted by the Board of Directors of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority on October 1, 2020, is hereby adopted in its entirety and without any modification or amendment. A true and correct copy of Ordinance No. 2020-1 is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The President of the Board of Directors of the District shall sign and the Secretary shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published and posted pursuant to the provisions of law in that regard and this Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final passage.

Section 3. Emerald Bay Service District Ordinance No. 20-10-21-1 entitled "An Ordinance of the Emerald Bay Service District Adopting by Reference Ordinance No. 2015-1 of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority Regulating Discharge to Sewerage Facilities" adopted by the Board of Directors of the Emerald Bay Service District on or about April 8, 2015 and is hereby repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.
